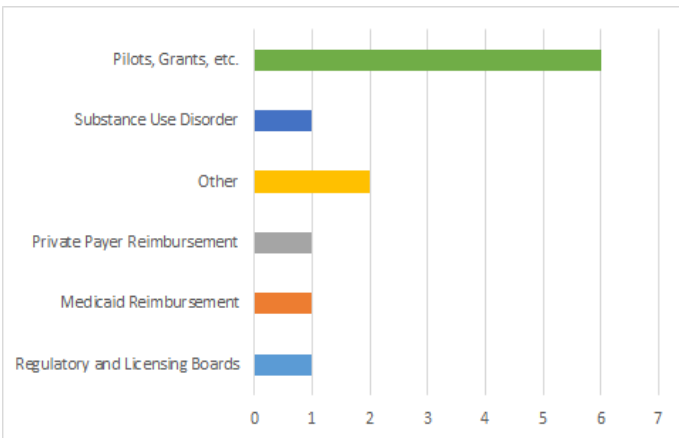

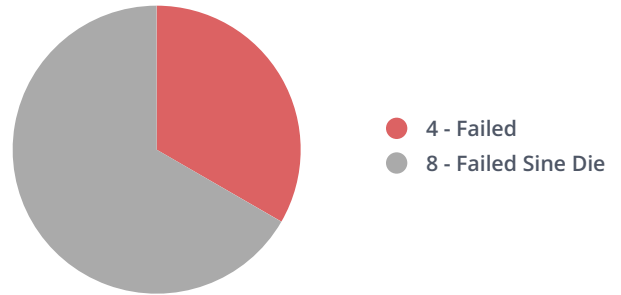
A few notes about this report:
